



Supply, Delivery and Environmental Planting Programme of 1,000 Indigenous Trees AICCT 1,000 Trees Legacy Programme – Arbor Week 2026

The **Anglo Inyosi Coal Community Trust (AICCT)** invites suitably qualified service providers to submit quotations for the implementation of its **1,000 Trees Legacy Programme**, which forms part of the Trust's 2026 Community Impact Programme.

The successful service provider will be responsible for the **supply, delivery and coordinated planting of 1,000 indigenous trees across 20 schools in the eMalahleni and Phola communities** during **Arbor Week 2026**.

This initiative seeks to create a lasting environmental legacy while educating young people on climate change, environmental stewardship and the importance of protecting our natural resources for future generations.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The programme aims to:

- Plant approximately **1,000 indigenous trees** across 20 schools.
- Improve the environmental sustainability and appearance of participating schools.
- Create greener, cooler and healthier learning environments.
- Educate learners about **global warming**, biodiversity and environmental conservation.
- Encourage learner ownership by ensuring every school actively participates in planting and caring for the trees.
- Leave a lasting environmental legacy aligned with AICCT's Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) objectives.

SCOPE OF WORK

The successful service provider shall provide the following services:

1. Supply of Trees

Supply approximately **1,000 healthy indigenous saplings** suitable for the Highveld climate.

Please note:

The Trust is **not seeking mature or fully grown trees**. Preference will be given to **young, healthy indigenous trees (saplings)** that can grow with the schools over many years and become part of each school's long-term environmental legacy.



Proposals should include:

- Tree species
- Average height
- Root bag/container size
- Expected growth rate
- Expected survival rate
- Maintenance requirements
- Reasons for species selection

2. Delivery

The successful bidder shall:

- Deliver trees to all **20 participating schools**.
- Ensure all deliveries are completed before planting commences.
- Provide a detailed delivery schedule.
- Protect all trees during transportation.

3. Planting Materials

The quotation must include all materials required for successful planting, including:

- Compost
- Mulch
- Stakes
- Tree guards
- Fertiliser
- Watering equipment
- Planting tools
- Labour



4. Learner Participation (Mandatory)

This project is centred around learner participation.

Bidders must demonstrate how they will actively involve learners throughout the planting process.

Every participating school must receive an engaging, hands-on experience where learners:

- Participate in planting the trees.
- Learn the correct planting techniques.
- Understand how trees improve air quality.
- Learn about biodiversity.
- Understand the effects of **global warming and climate change**.
- Commit to caring for the trees after planting.

Learners should leave the programme inspired to become environmental ambassadors within their schools and communities.

5. Interactive Environmental Education Programme

Each bidder must include an exciting, educational and interactive programme that will be delivered at every participating school.

The programme should be suitable for both primary and secondary school learners and may include:

- Environmental games
- Climate change demonstrations
- Tree planting competitions
- STEM-based environmental activities
- Environmental quizzes
- Storytelling
- Group discussions
- "Adopt a Tree" initiatives
- Tree naming activities
- Environmental pledges
- Fun team-building exercises



6. Programme Delivery Schedule

The proposal must include a detailed implementation programme aligned with the following schedule:

Monday, 31 August 2026

- Delivery of all trees to participating schools.

Tuesday – Friday (1–4 September 2026)

- Tree planting at all participating schools.
- Interactive environmental education programme.
- Learner participation activities.
- Photography and community engagement.

7. Detailed Implementation Plan (Mandatory)

Bidders must submit a detailed implementation methodology demonstrating how they will successfully deliver the programme.

The plan must include:

- Overall implementation schedule
- School-by-school programme
- Delivery schedule
- Resource allocation
- Staffing structure
- Risk management plan
- Communication plan
- Project management approach



8. PRICING SCHEDULE

Bidders must provide a detailed cost breakdown including:

- Supply of trees
- Delivery
- Labour
- Compost and planting materials
- Tree guards and stakes
- Educational materials
- Interactive learner programme
- Project management
- Contingency
- Total Tender Price
